



Parent/Student Protocols under COVID-19
Arrival, Dismissal, Cohorts and School-day Protocols

- Parents, please note we have a 6-foot health zone by our front door, please do not enter the zone.
- NO PARENTS MAY ENTER THE SCHOOL BUILDING.
- Arriving at school all Early Childhood parents please sign your child's sheet, spray the binder with Lysol and use the hand sanitizer to disinfect your hands.
- All families please keep a 6-foot distance between each other when waiting outside to enter the building.
- All students arriving at school, please wait outside until a teacher takes your temperature and asks parents/guardians the following questions:
 - Is anyone in your household taking fever reducing medication or medication for respiratory issues? Answer needs to be no, for admittance.
 - Has anyone in your household taken a COVID-19 test? Answer needs to be no, for admittance. (Please note, some parents are required to take a weekly test, these types of tests will not be included in the admittance decision.)
 - Has anyone in the household been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19? Answer needs to be no, for admittance.
 - Have you joined with another cohort that is not your usual family household? Answer needs to be no, for admittance
 - Parents/guardians will be asked to initial a paper in response to these questions
- Adults and students older than two years old, before entering the school grounds, have your mask on your face – this is a current CA mandate.
- Upon entering the school and walking to your classroom, take off your shoes and place them outside or on your class shoe rack, or as directed by your teacher.
- **NO backpacks or other items other than a lunch box and a CMIA or cloth bookbag may enter the school with a child.**

- Students remember that we are keeping a safe distance of 6-feet from each other so your teachers will have assigned you to a special area in your classroom. This is where you will be working to stay healthy and safe.
- Playground experiences for students will continue as usual.
- Faculty only are responsible for cleaning materials and their classroom. We use EcoLab's professional cleaners which clean and disinfect and are COVID compliant as well as ecofriendly.
- Remember to always use the 7-step hand washing protocol that you have been shown, and to wash your hands more than you think you need to do so. A good idea is to wash your hands every time you've worked with a material.

School Dismissal

- Parents, please knock on the door if you do not see a staff member in the dismissal area and then step back away from the 6-foot zone at the front door. If you intend to come earlier than our regular dismissal times, please let your classroom teacher know to make sure that there is someone who can dismiss your child.
- Arriving at school all Early Childhood parents please sign your child out for the day, spray the binder with Lysol and use the hand sanitizer to disinfect your hands.
- We will dismiss students from the front door; as we have different areas in which the children may be at dismissal time, please wait patiently as we ensure each child has all belongings before being dismissed.
- Students make certain that you have washed your hands before leaving the school and do not touch anything on the way out, if you can help it.
- When you get home, if you can, we suggested that you Lysol spray or wipe down with a cleaning cloth/paper towel the soles of shoes, bookbags and lunch boxes.
- Remove all your clothes and place in the washer.
- After removing clothes remember to wash your hands again.

Families, Travel and Exposure to other Cohorts than usual Household

CA Health Department Mandate

To contain any contamination of the virus in the school and thereby causing program closures, we are mandated to implement these health safety procedures:

If a child visits other people who are not usually in the regular household/daily cohort, the child/ren will be asked to self-quarantine for 14 days or take a COVID test after 5 days of exposure.

If a child/ren leave/s the state of California, the child/ren will be asked to self-quarantine for 14 days or take a COVID test after 5 days of exposure.
